26 Sonatas (Pieces by Beethoven, Haydn, Mozart)

Johann Dussek was a well-known, Bohemian born pianist of the late 1700's, admired for his "singing" style of performance, and as one of the pioneers of piano technique. This collection of six sonatinas, Op. 20, includes works in G Major, C Major, F Major, A

Major, C Major, and E-flat Major.

Ann Pope's piano duo arrangement captures the rhythmic drive of the original orchestral setting, and also offers each performer an equal opportunity with the dance melodies. A real crowd pleaser!

Mozart's Adagio and Rondo (K. 617) was written for the armonica, or musical glasses (a set of tuned glass bowls) and a quartet consisting of flute, oboe, viola, and cello. The music is effectively played as an organ solo. The Adagio may be registered "forte," in the style of Mozart's Fantasia (K. 608). The Rondo should be played on the flute stops. Arranged for organ by E. Power Briggs.
